COMMENTARY CORNER: “THE COMPASSION OF A FATHER FOR ANGRY CHILDREN” (# 3) “And he was angry, and would not go in: therefore came his father out, and intreated him. And he answering said to his father, Lo, these many years do I serve thee, neither transgressed and I at any time thy commandment: and yet thou never gavest me a kid, that I might make merry with my friends:” (Luke 15:28—29).

Jesus ministered to children of God who knew that they were in need of a Savior. Common men heard him gladly (Mark 12:37). Men and women in the categories of publicans and sinners heard him (Luke 15:1). These accepted that, like the son we call the prodigal, they had wasted their substance with ungodly living.

Let us acknowledge that it is an advantage and not a weakness to be able to admit we need a Savior. It is wisdom and not foolishness to be able to confess faults before God. It is sincerity and honesty and not insincerity and dishonesty to proclaim dependence on the need to be led by the Holy Spirit. The children of God are always at an advantage when they accept their dependence on a merciful and loving God.

Sons and daughters of God also do well to have the desire to want to please God. It is commendable to know the Father’s will and seek to do it. And there are actually men and women who, as much as they are able, seek to walk uprightly before God. These do not have the same desire to explore life away from the father as do others.

We need to remind ourselves that while some choose to take their substance and to go into a far country, this is not the only road to self awareness and growth possible. One need not become involved in riotous living. It is not necessary when coming to maturity to taste test alcohols. It is not mandatory to explore the highs brought on by illegal drugs. It is not compulsory to lie around, sleep around, and go around with all who are interested in sexual re-

lations. It is not compulsory that we make it a project to put together a portfolio of deeds done for later reflection on our lives of worldliness. Everyone need not choose to seek out the bright lights of dark and ungodly living.

Let us understand, too, that the Father has children in both bedrooms under his roof. In the one is the child who would take his journey into a far country. In the other is the child who chooses to stay home and to please his father. This is certainly the story that Jesus relates when teaching about the man who had two sons. For whatever reason, the younger son was the one who demanded that his inheritance be given to him (Luke 15:12).

What was it that caused the younger son to demand his portion? Was it that he was perhaps spoiled as younger children have been known to be? Was it that he felt that as long as there was an older brother, his path in life could only go so far? Was he bored, maybe disgusted with what appeared to be a dead end life of everyday routines, seasonal expectations, and annual renewals of commitments to the same? In his own mind there was a good enough reason to strive to make it away from the guarded provision of his father.

There is a lesson for all parents who are met with the demands of a son or daughter. There would be a tendency to discuss, to reason, to argue, to show frustration, to beg, and to plead with the offspring. But we must realize that there does come a time when wanderers will prepare to wander, explorers will gear up to explore, and thrill seekers will

be energized by imagined thrills to pursue those thrills. The mother has a choice, the father has a choice; when the child is reared in the nurture and admonition of the Lord, even then parents must be careful not to provoke to wrath and anger (Ephesians 6:4). Angry adults begin their growth as angry children.

The road leading to the far country and dim lights, on the map, is not the only road we must be careful on which not to construct anger lanes. The halls and paths in the home, near the father, can become lanes that lead to justification for anger. And this is the story of the older son.

The older son did not ask that his inheritance be given him, though it was divided for him (Luke 15:12). He did not seek leave into the far country. He did not expect to wander, to explore, and to be thrilled. He did not experience the shame and humiliation of having realized that he wasted what was his, experienced the sensation of extreme hunger, and exchanged his seat at his father’s table for space around the feeding trough of hogs. But this older son also had some misunderstandings about his father.

Love from the father understands that there would be no love if it were dependent on children always thinking and doing right. The father loves because he is father. And the father is not ashamed of the love he has for children when they are good or wayward. The older son did not understand the love and compassion of his own father.

COMMENTARY CORNER

When fathers are confronted with the anger of their children, they understand that it is not necessary to meet anger with anger. The older sons of their homes may not waste their substance with riotous living, but they manifest the need for the understanding and love of the father who has the younger son under his roof.

How sad it is that when the family wants to celebrate one child, the other is upset and hurt. How tragic, even, it is that when the dancing is lively and the music of celebration can be heard, one child will pout, will be sad, will refuse to be cheerful, will show anger. For many, this has been the kind of child that one would turn away from in disgust.

How tempting it is to deal with the angry child in anger, to tell the child that if he wants it that way, forget about him, let him do what he will, and talk about why he should know better—after all that was done for him.

But the father who showed the compassion of putting a robe, sandals, and ring on one child has the compassion to go out to his angry child and to help him understand that he is loved (Luke 15:28). Let us not miss the needs met for both of these sons.

For one son, it was necessary to run to meet him. For the other, it was needful for him to leave the party to assure him of what was his. Hear the father, "Son, thou art ever with me, and all that I have is thine" (Luke 15:31).

The inheritance had been divided between the sons, but the father assures the older son that all the father has is his. We should speak a word to those who have imagined themselves different from the younger brother, more noble than the younger brother, more holy than the younger brother, wiser than the younger brother, regardless of whether we avoid the entrapments of a world gone wild or expose ourselves to the dangers of a wayward life, we are all created to have need and acceptance of a loving father. We need learn that father's love and compassion for all. Otherwise, we travel as far a journey as any younger brother. Let us not transgress by refusing to love as God loves. Understand that we all have need of salvation.
