COMMENTARY CORNER: EVANGELISM FOCUS: "BUT FOR THEM ALSO: WORKERS BEYOND THE APOSTLES" "Neither pray I for these alone, but for them also which shall believe on me through their word: That they all may be one; as thou, Father, art in me, and I in thee, that they also may be one in us: that the world may believe that thou hast sent me" (John 17:20, 21). esus labored to prepare a small group of men to be the frontline ambassadors for the great commission. He especially trained and mentored them, guarding and protecting them from distractions, misconceptions, egotistical ambitions, and compassionless interaction with others. We are to understand that no group of men would ever have a more important assignment than did these apostles. Their work was the greatest work ever to be carried out by mortal men. It naturally follows, however, that one would ask how the mission was to be carried forward after the lifetime of the apostles.

There were to be generations of believers after the apostles passed from the scene of the temporal into the far better existence of being in the presence of God. Who would have the passion, love, zeal, spirit of sacrifice, commitment, determination and faith instilled in the men who walked with Jesus? What would the great commission lose in intensity once a generation of workers landed on the shores of lost cities who did not witness Jesus walk on water, speak to the winds, calm the seas, allay fears, and safely deliver His beloved apostles? What did Jesus expect? What was heaven's expectation?

We must remember that in Jesus' intense prayer for the apostles whom He had called out of the world, that the prayer does not conclude before Jesus focuses His words on those who would believe on Him through the apostles' words (John 17:20, 21). How our souls should rejoice when reading the words,

"Neither pray I for these alone, but for them also"! There is a group of people more numerous than the small group of men who first stood to proclaim, "This same Jesus whom you have crucified, God has made Him both Lord and Christ" (Acts 2:36). This group is the "but for them also" group.

The people in this group were not there when Jesus healed Jairus' daughter (Luke 8:49-56), but Jesus prayed for them also. The men and women numbered in this group were not there when Jesus stood with Moses and Elijah on the mount of transfiguration (Mark 9:1-8), but Jesus prayed for them also. The blessed persons accepting the exhortation, "repent and be baptized" (Acts 2:38-41), were not there with Peter, James, and John walked with Jesus in the garden, when He prayed, "not my will, but thine be done" (Luke 22:42), but Jesus prayed for them also.

How does this realization affect our understanding of the work of saving the world, the work of the apostles, and the great commission? Jesus makes several statements and requests in His prayer about what He hoped to accomplish through the apostles. He asks that the Father keep through His name those He had given Jesus, and that those men would be one (John 17:11). He prays that the apostles not be taken out of the world, but kept from the evil one (John 17:15). He prays that the Father sanctify them through the truth (John 17:17). He prays that as the Father has sent Him into the world, even so He sends the apostles into the world (John 17:18). In summary, He prays that the Father

keep the apostles, that the apostles be one, that the apostles be kept from the evil one, that they be sanctified through the truth, and that they go into the world. Those words are for the apostles.

There are words beyond the words for the apostles that call us to service in our generation. Those words: "Neither pray I for these alone, but for them also which shall believe on me through their words: That they all may be one; as thou Father, art in me, and I in thee, that they also may be one in us: that the world may believe that thou hast sent me" (John 17:20, 21). Pray God we don't miss the significance of these words!

Jesus' words cover and bless those who believe on Him through the apostles' words. All who have obeyed the apostles' words are blessed, sanctified, justified and saved beneficiaries of this prayer of Jesus. Then the words call for a relationship that complements the relationship between the Father and the Son: They are One. Jesus prays that those who believe be one with the apostles. And there is more! Not only are the ambassadors for Christ and the believers one with one another, the greatest significance is that they are also one in the Father and the Son! What greater place to be is there than this? What greater reason to be motivated to join in the work is there than this?

COMMENTARY CORNER

The particular work for which the apostles were prepared was the work of preaching the gospel. In their generation, they preached the gospel throughout the world. But were not alone in their efforts.

We acknowledge that heaven was with them. But heaven's participation is not limited to what transpires on the throne as Jesus is with us always, even until the end of the world. Heaven's preparation includes working in the lives of men and women who would continue the work of fulfilling the great commission for generations to come.

Preparation for transition to minis-

try through those other than the apostles began very early in the life of the church. What study will show is that the church was moved forward, not just by the work of the apostles, but also by the several men and women whose hearts and minds were filled with the passion, love, and commitment necessary to be involved in the work of saving souls.

And thank God that the zeal, along with the concomitant thanksgiving, appreciation, and passion necessary to do God's bidding, thrived from that day, even to our time. That is, the church today does not expect to be less committed, less moved, less motivated, or less

intense in this work and ministry. How can we be when Jesus has prayed for us also? And do we not have reason to be intensely involved in the work of the church?

The Son who gave sight to the blind, hearing to the deaf, healing for all kinds of infirmities prayed for us also. The Lamb who fed thousands, comforted the least of the little ones, and raised the dead, prayed for us also. The Savior who walked the waters, hushed the winds and calmed the seas prayed for us also. And the Risen One who was with the church during the days of the apostles is with us also.
