COMMENTARY CORNER: "I Will, Be Thou Clean" "And it came to pass, when he was in a certain city, behold a man full of leprosy; who seeing Jesus fell on his face, and besought him, saying, Lord, if thou wilt, thou canst make me clean. And he put forth his hand, and touched him, saying, I will, be thou clean. And immediately the leprosy departed from him" (Luke 5:12 -13).

esus offered more than any who would ever walk the earth. And not only did he have more to offer, he was also able to meet any need men and women might have had. There was nothing in life, no area of life, no aspect related to living for which Jesus had no answer or power. These truths should have been a source of comfort for the people of God, for the whole world.

It was not just that he had the greatest power and ability, Iesus was also willing to freely give to others. There is a difference in having abundant bread and willingness to give that bread. There is a difference in having power and a willingness to use that power to help others. There is a difference in having wisdom and being able to share that wisdom with those willing to with men and women. We have yet to hear. Jesus had great and incomparable abilities, power, and means. What makes him Savior is his willingness to share those things with the world.

Discouragement in the world results from so many people who have refused to be concerned about those who may have needs, even in their own families. We learn to live with rejection, disappointment, and discouragement. We live so long with this that it warps our relationships with others. We really do not expect others to have understanding, to have sympathy, to have compassion. The truth is that when we are dejected for so long, we lose hope. We feel vulnerable to the vicissitudes of life.

Vulnerability is a universal disposition. Many have had those moments when they felt that hope for deliverance was beyond them. Universally, all share an inner consciousness of despair. Who has not had those times when life seemed like have noted to this point is that life treats

falling off a high cliff into an abyss of indiscernible despair? Life can be frustrating. It can be so frustrating that things we believed we would never do, we end up doing. We reach a point when we decide that whatever the consequences we must ask another for help.

When it comes to salvation, we do not have to reach such a frustration level. Iesus desires to do what he can for us. Yet many do not come to him until they reach moments of desperation. It is not desperation that is needed to come to the Lord, it is insight and truth. We should all acknowledge that our lives and destinies are not ultimately in our hands. Our present and future security are in the hands of God.

We live life, but life did not originate create life in laboratories and test tubes. We have treated diseases, but death will come still. Our destinies are determined by heaven's agenda. Our hands are not what will finally save us. Our hope is built on what Jesus is able to accomplish with his hands.

Let us remind ourselves that we are always safer in the hands of Jesus than we are in our own hands or the hands of others. A leper realized this one day as he was in the presence of Jesus. He speaks to some truths that should guide us today. He confesses that Jesus is the one who could make him clean (Luke 5:12).

Jesus was able to make the man clean. Jesus was able to make him whole. And Jesus was willing to do the same. Jesus responds, "I will, be thou clean." What we underscore in this encounter between Jesus and the leper is that God responds when we are willing to ask. And what we

us in such a way that we are shy about asking. We show evidence of an unwillingness to ask in many spheres in life. This is sometimes because of stubbornness and at other times because of disappointment.

How many drivers remain lost for significant time because they refuse to ask for directions? How often do students take a bad grade because they are unwilling to ask for help? People go hungry because they do not want to ask others for bread. People will need to get from one point to another but refuse to ask someone for a ride. Even in families, spouses grow weary of asking things from each other Children are afraid to ask parents for help. Disappointment is a strong deterrent to people asking for what they need in life.

The distrustful disposition is a learned one. Too many had to work up the nerve to ask another to do something only to be disappointed. Perhaps you remember that it took two weeks for you to ask your parents to do something and when you finally worked up enough nerve, it seemed like, with no thought at all, they denied your request and summarily dismissed you. You tried reasoning and pleading but to no avail. When one goes through a few of those episodes, one asks self, why one should even bother. We must be taught to expect different results when we

COMMENTARY CORNER

The leper understood that it was up to Jesus. And we must remember that if we want our futures, our possibilities, our desires in life in the hands of anyone, it should be Jesus. The leper does not come to force Jesus, or to make demands on Jesus. He simply asks that it be the will of Jesus. He knows the power of the thought, "your will be done."

More encouraging than the asking is the answer. Jesus says, "I will," and "be thou clean." After all the disappointments; after all the sleepless nights; after all the days of trying to discover when help would come; after all that parents, and children, and friends, and associates, and professionals could not do, what is encouragement and hope is the realization of what Jesus can do. And not only what he can do, but what he is willing to do. Jesus says, "I will."

People refuse to hear you, to recognize you, to appreciate you? Jesus says, "I will." Professionals insist that there is no help for you, that they will not hear about your pain any longer? Jesus says, "I will." Friends ignore your plea, dismiss your cry, cannot see your need? Jesus says, "I will." Religious experts, philosophers, wise people do not give sound direction? Jesus says, "I will." When a persons realizes that he cannot keep himself, maintain himself, or save himself; Jesus says, "I will."

There is again however something that

we must be willing to do. We need to be willing simply to ask. With all we face, we should have confidence enough to ask Jesus. With what we know about his power, his love, and his grace; we should be willing to ask Jesus. When we consider our frailties, our weaknesses, our mistakes, and our failures, we should be willing to ask Jesus.

Is there really any reason to continue with an inability to hear, with blindness, with disease, with leprosy, with pain, with disappointment, with despair, with hopelessness when we could simply ask Jesus?

Let us praise God for the faith of a leprous man who knew that if heaven said the same, he could be healed. Let us also be healed.
